Plaques will be presented to the department heads of the winning universities on behalf of their chapters at the 25<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting of ECEDHA, the Electrical and Computer Engineering Department Heads Association.

Winners were chosen based on a calculation of person-hours of service, recruitment rates, retention of inductees, and faculty involvement. All HKN chapters are expected to perform service activities at the department, university, and community levels. They are often seen guiding department tours, tutoring underclassmen, running a student lounge, organizing career fairs, fundraising for a community project, or mentoring elementary students.

Each chapter is required to submit an Annual Chapter Report at the end of the academic year providing the appropriate statistics to the headquarters office and the Outstanding Chapter Award committee.
